A note from Miss Cooke

By the time we get to February half term, we are officially half way through the school year! So when we come back after the holidays, the children are closer to being in their next year group than they are to being in their last year group! Time flies when you are having fun! This week prior to February half term is National Internet Safety week where many schools across the country will celebrate Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 11th February. While we talk about internet safety regularly at school, parents and carers also have a vital part to play in ensuring that any child accessing the internet is safe. These are all questions for every parent to consider – especially this week.

Parental Supervision

It has been noticed on a number of occasions that children in Year 4 or below are not being accompanied to school each morning and are being left on the playground before school without suitable supervision.

The safety, behaviour and well-being of the children remains with parents until 8.45am each morning. This means that all children below Y5 should be brought to school every morning and parents **MUST** wait with their children and see them go in



to school safely. Any parents who are not complying with this are being neglectful to their children. Should parents require children to be supervised by school staff before 8.45am, they can make a booking for Breakfast club that operates from 8am every morning. Details of breakfast club can be found on the school web site or from the school office. Any children below Year 4 who are seen arriving at school unsupervised by an **adult**, will be noted and parents contacted. If the situation continues parents will be expected to attend a meeting with Miss Cooke to discuss the situation.







End of School Day

Parents are reminded that for EYFS, Y1, Y2, Y3, and Y4 school ends at 3.30pm and parents should be waiting for their children at the classroom doors. A number of parents with children in Y5 and 6 have not been collecting their children at 3.30pm, but only arriving at school to collect at 3.35pm or after.

We understand that sometimes difficulties occur or there are traffic problems, but when it is the same children every day not being collected on time it is unfair to the children and staff. Children can become worried if parents are not on time to collect them.

Please be on time to collect your children. The situation is being monitored and records of children collected late are being kept.

Sponsored Bounce - Tuesday 3rd March 2020



On **Tuesday 3rd March 2020** we will be holding a sponsored bounce to raise money to replace and enhance our range of reading books in school. Last year's sponsored bounce was very well supported, raising £1,500 and we hope to be just as successful this year. Every sponsor that we receive helps us to make this aim a reality and all sponsors are greatly appreciated. Please encourage family and friends to sponsor your child and their school. Please return the sponsor form to your child's class teacher by **Monday 2nd March 2020**. We will record the number of bounces that your child completes and return the form to you so that you can collect the sponsor money. Please return the form with all sponsor money by **Friday 13th March 2020**.


<u>Attendance</u>
