In these strange times it is great that as a school we can still take part in some familiar events and have fun in the process. A **HUGE** thank you to parents and families for their kind donations. We raised £220 and this will be sent to Pudsey's piggy bank to help support the work that Children in Need do at home in the UK and abroad.

I would like to thank most parents for complying with our request to wear a face covering when on the school site. As was explained previously this is to try and protect the whole school family and try and keep the school free from a case of Covid as long as possible. I am aware that there are some parents and carers who are exempt from wearing face masks, I would ask that those who are exempt wear their lanyards when they come on to the school site so that your exemption is easily recognisable.

I still have to raise the fact that there are a few parents, carers and those who drop off and collect children from school who are not observing the one-way system, especially if a member of staff is not out on the playground. The gate to Slade Walk, outside Amber classroom is **AN OUT GATE** – no parents, carers or children should enter the school site via this gate – even if they are only going to Amber class. We ask, for the safety of **ALL** coming on to the school site, that the one-way system is observed.

As I am sure you will appreciate, the school will NOT be putting on any Christmas productions this year. We are trying to make some arrangements so that parents are able to see some form of very brief performance by the children through the use of technology. This is very much in the planning stage and a hope at present, but we hope to be able to share viewing guidance soon. Cross your fingers!!!

COVID 19 Advice - Reminder

No child should attend school if **they or any member of their household** are displaying any of the following symptoms of Covid 19:-

- **high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child starts to display these symptoms, we ask that you inform the school why your child is not in school and obtain a test for Covid 19. Once the results of the test are obtained, we ask that you communicate this to the school.

Attached at the end of this newsletter is the Bedford Borough flowchart to assist parents in making decisions about when to send a child to school. This flowchart is also displayed on our school website.



Reading

Many teachers have noticed a reduction in the number of parents who are reading with their children each evening.

We are aware that most parents supported their children in an unprecedented way during the initial lockdown and worked hard with them on the learning tasks that the school set. This was a huge support to each child.

But now that children are back in school and working hard to catch up on the learning that was missed as a result of part time attendance or not attending school, your children **NEED** your help again!

Please, please listen to them read as often as you possibly can, every evening would be fantastic, but 3 or 4 times a week would also make a **HUGE** difference.

As I informed parents in my October newsletter, we do not have the army of reading volunteers that usually come into school each week to support children reading and so now more than ever it is vital that parents do all they can to listen to their children read.

All homework tasks that are set are designed to help your child practice skills and reinforce the knowledge that they have covered in school. They support their learning and may prepare for future learning. If your child does not complete homework they are missing that learning opportunity.

The frequency and amount of homework varies according to the age of the child, but the importance of reading and discussions about what has been read, does not fade as the child moves up the school.

Bedford Modern School Swimming Pool Car Park

Edith Cavell and Livingstone schools have been contacted by BMS, to ask us to remind parents that the car park and area around the front of the BMS Swimming Pool is not a public right of way and as such parents should not use it as a cut through to Clarendon Street and beyond.



We would ask that you respect all our neighbours' property and ensure that when walking to and from school you remain on the public highway and if you are driving you park respectfully on the roads surrounding the school.

No Pens Day Wednesday is an annual day of spoken language activities that takes place in schools, colleges and early years' settings across the country.

Spoken language skills (sometimes called **oracy**) are fundamental for learning to read and write, managing emotions, developing friendships and entering employment.



In school, we will be putting out pens, pencils, writing and drawing implements away for the day and focusing on learning through developing and using our language.

<u>Jewellery</u>



Please can we remind parents and children that **NO** jewellery should be worn for school. This includes earrings, smart watches, necklaces, bracelets or rings.

If your child has pierced ears, we would request that if they are unable to remove and replace earrings themselves, that parents remove the earrings at home prior to coming

to school and replace them at the end of the school day.

No jewellery can be worn for health and safety reasons during PE lessons and if your child has long hair this must also be tied back. School accepts no responsibility for any items lost at school.

Attendance






The winners of Attendance Bear in October have been 28th Sept - 2nd Oct Aquamarine, Jade and Ruby Class

Coronavirus information for Parents/Carers (Sept/October 2020)

For general advice about COVID-19 and the symptoms to look for go to: www.nhs.uk/coronavirus

Child, or someone in your household, develops symptoms of COVID-19: new continuous cough (coughing frequently for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours) and/or high temperature and/or a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If your child is at home, do not send them to their education setting. Inform the setting through absence reporting. If your child develops symptoms at their education setting, they will be separated from others and sent home.

If your child, or anyone in your household, has symptoms they must isolate at home for 10 days (from date of onset of symptoms). If your child does not have symptoms but someone in the household does, your child and all other household members without symptoms must isolate at home for 14 days.

Book a test as soon as possible for anyone in your household with symptoms. This can be done online at:

www.nhs.uk/coronavirus.

Alternatively a test can be ordered by phone on NHS 119 for those without the internet.

Your closest test location will be offered when you book, and both drive-in and walk-in tests are available in Bedford. You may need to visit the website regularly for more slots to be released. If you are not able to walk or drive to the test centre, and no-one you live with can take you, you can request a home test kit.

Do not take a taxi or use public transport.

Result of test (you will receive this by email or text message).

It is important you inform the setting of the result as soon as possible.

Negative

Child/staff member can return to setting once well. Inform setting of positive test result as soon as possible.

Positive

If your child is identified as having been in close contact with a confirmed case, they will be asked to self-isolate for 14 days. The rest of the household does not need to isolate unless the child/close contact develops symptoms. ONLY GO FOR A TEST IF SYMPTOMATIC

For medical advice call NHS 111, or in an emergency call 999

Ensure positive case completes remainder of 10 day isolation period (from date of onset of symptoms). Household members without symptoms should complete 14 day isolation – even if they have received a negative test result.

NHS test and trace service will send you a text or email alert or call you with instructions of how to share details of people with whom you have had close, recent contact and places you have visited.

If a child is a confirmed case they can return to school after 10 days. However if they still have a temperature, diarrhoea or are being sick they should wait a further 48 hours after these symptoms stop. If a household member is a confirmed case, but child does not develop symptoms, they can return to setting only after completing the 14 days household isolation period.
