#Hello Yellow

On Friday 18th October we will be supporting the Children's mental health charity Young Minds by holding a wear it yellow day and inviting the children to come to school dressed in the colour Yellow and making a minimum £1 donation to the charity. Children's mental health is a growing concern across the country so in holding this day we are hoping to make a contribution to this very worthwhile charity.

Parental supervision

It has been noticed on a number of occasions that children in Year 4 or below are not being accompanied to school each morning and are being left on the playground before school without suitable supervision.

The safety, behaviour and well-being of the children remains with parents until 8.45am each morning. This means that all children below Y5 should be brought to school every morning and parents **MUST** wait with their children and see them go in to school safely. Any parents who are not complying with this are being neglectful to their children. Should parents require children to be supervised by school staff before 8.45am, they can make a booking for Breakfast club that operates from 8am every morning. Details of breakfast club can be found on the school web site or from the school office.

Smoking on or outside the school site

The school site remains a total non-smoking or vaping site, but please could we respectfully ask parents to refrain from smoking or vaping just outside the school gates so other parents and children do not have to pass through second hand smoke.



School Applications

A reminder to Y6 parents that all applications for Y7 school places starting in September 2020 must be made to the borough by 31st October 2019. This can be completed either on line or via a paper application form, but all applications must be with the borough **BY** 31st October 2019. If any parents would appreciate support with the application process, please contact the school before half term.

For nursery parents wanting to request a school place in reception for September 2020, the application process opened on 26th September 2019 and all applications must be received by the borough by 15th January 2020. Similar to the process for Y7, applications can be made on line or via a paper application. Again if any parents would like support with the application process please contact the school.

Packed Lunches



Please could we remind parents Edith Cavell is a NUT FREE ZONE, so please ensure that there are no nuts included in packed lunches or snacks. Please remember to include a drink with your child's packed lunch. Your child's packed lunch should be a healthy meal balanced and therefore not include large amounts of chocolate. If you are providing **grapes** as part of your child's packed lunch, please ensure that they are cut length ways to avoid the risk of choking.

Water bottles

Every child should bring a water bottle to school every day as it has been scientifically proven that a brain that is hydrated functions and learns better than one that is not hydrated.

That said, we have had an increase lately of reading and library books becoming damaged due to leaking water bottles in book bags.

Please could we ask that water bottles are not routinely put in book bags to be carried to and from school in order to prevent damage to books, homework or worksheets in the book bag.

NSPCC Underwear Rule

In our PSHE lessons this term, we will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule. This is designed to teach pupils how to stay safe from sexual abuse without giving explicit information or telling scary stories or even using the term "sexual abuse". In the lesson, children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for

- Privates are Private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help

The lesson will be delivered in a way that's fully age appropriate.

Parking on Manton Lane, Turner Way and Kneller Close

We again respectfully ask that parents observe the Highway Code, road markings and respect our neighbours when parking to collect or drop off children to school.

I have again been contacted by more than one local resident who is unhappy at the way in which and where parents are parking when coming to collect or drop off children at school. Every driver is responsible for ensuring that when they park they obey road markings, road signage and show consideration for the residents of the street on which they are parking. I have advised the residents who have contacted the school that they should contact Bedford Borough Council and the Police if they feel any road traffic rules have been broken by motorists when parking their cars. Inconsiderate parking on local roads paints the school in a bad light with local residents and tarnishes the schools good reputation in the local community and I would strongly urge every driver to examine their own behaviours and consider parking further away and walking in to school. This will also have health benefits for parents and children alike.

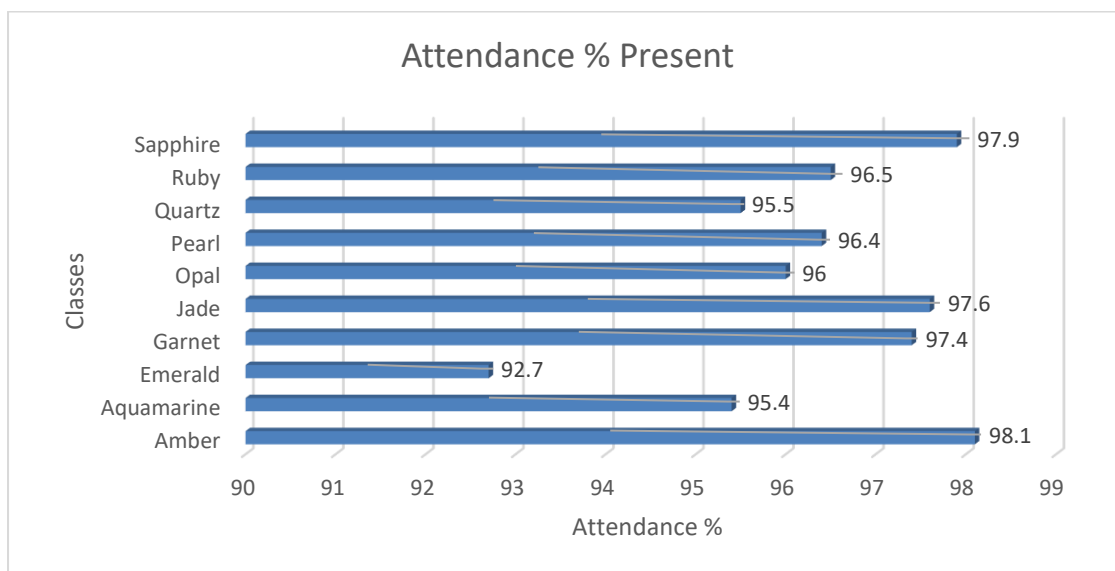
Attendance

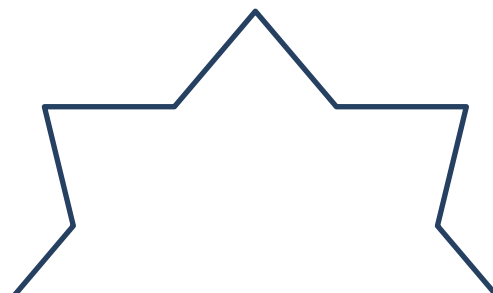
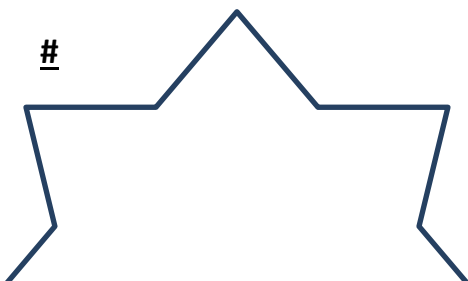
