A note from Miss Cooke

I do hope that every parent has seen the change of dates for December that was sent out last week. The amended dates are also included at the end of this newsletter. This change of dates has been necessary due to the calling of a General Election on **Thursday 12th December**. **School will be closed on this day.**

I am very aware that school being closed on this day can be very inconvenient for parents, but it is a necessary response to the school being used as a Polling Station to ensure the safety and safeguarding of all the children. Advance notice - Please note that we also expect that the school will also be used as a Polling Station on **Thursday 7th May 2020**.

A reminder that on these dark nights when it is not possible for the children to be outside after school, we would ask that parents take advantage to support their children with homework and support the development of basic skills. The basics include daily reading, learning spellings and times tables as well as completing specific homework tasks. On the school web site there are also a list of age appropriate web sites that children could also access to support learning at home.

For any parents who wish to support their child with their maths homework, but sometimes find that the maths calculation methods that we teach in school are very different from the ways in which they learnt, the school calculation policy is available on the school web site and it explains in a step by step way the methods taught in school.

PE Kit

Every child is required to have in school each day a full PE kit **including suitable shoes**. Over the last few months it has become clear that a number of children do not have appropriate footwear available for PE lessons. It is not suitable for children to wear their normal school shoes for PE lessons as these shoes are not designed to be worn in PE. They are not flexible enough.

Equally can I remind you that all children should come to school in black shoes and not trainers. Trainers and plimsolls are required for P.E. lessons and should be available to change into on P.E. days but should not be worn all day. Also, girls are not allowed to wear knee length boots in school. They can be very uncomfortable and make it very difficult for the girls to sit on the floor during assembly, carpet time etc. If they wear them to walk to school please ensure that you bring their school shoes with them to change in to.



Parental Opinions


Reading Books

We have had to throw away a number of Reading Books recently as they have been discovered to have been damaged beyond repair. Damage has included pages being ripped out, pages being defaced with pictures, writing or scribble and water damage from leaking water bottles.


These damaged books have reduced our reading book stock and this may limit your child.

We would ask all parents and carers to ensure that books are returned to school in good repair and that if a book is damaged this is brought to the attention of staff.

Midday Supervisors


We currently have vacancies for relief Midday Supervisors here in school. Please contact the school office if you would like further information.

Punctuality

Since half term there has been an increase in the number of children that are arriving at school after the 8.55am bell when classroom doors are closed. This is a very worrying trend and we ask that you make concerted efforts to ensure that your child is in school and ready for registration at 8.55am. Being late regularly has a negative impact on your child's learning. We will be keeping careful records of children that are late and the reasons for lateness. These will be passed on to the Education Welfare Officer in cases where there is persistent lateness.

We would like to remind all parents that children should NOT play on the outside play equipment, or field at the start or end of the day and that scooters and bikes should not be ridden on the school grounds.


