### **A note from Miss Cooke**

Happy New Year – I know that sounds strange this far in to the new year – but as this is the first newsletter of the new year, it does still seem appropriate.

I have already shared with the parents and children in Garnet class the news that following complications in her pregnancy, back in October, Mrs Jackson had to commence her maternity leave much earlier than planned.

I must now sadly inform the whole school community that Mr and Mrs Jackson's son was born in mid-October, but despite medical professionals best efforts, family and friends positive thoughts and prayers, he passed away peacefully in early December.

This has been an extremely difficult period of time for Mrs Jackson and her family and I appreciate that this news may affect individuals within our school community in different ways.

The children have been informed of this sad news by their class teachers and all staff at the school have endeavoured to answer any questions that the children have sensitively and in an age appropriate manner, but anticipate that some children may be upset by the news.

Mrs Jackson is planning to return to the school for individual days in the second half of the spring term and on a more full time basis sometime in the summer term. At present, Miss Milbourn will remain Garnet class teacher until future plans and arrangements are formalised.

I have become increasingly concerned towards the end of last term and in the start of this term at the number of children who either do not have their PE kits or do not have appropriate footwear for their PE kits. Providing a named PE kit for your child is part of the Home School Agreement that every parent signs at the start of each school year. Children should change from their uniform to undertake PE lessons and having appropriate footwear that fits correctly is important to ensure that the children can safely take part fully in lessons. At this time of year, some lessons may be taking place outdoors, so we would also encourage parents to provide jogging bottoms **as well** as shorts in their child's PE kit.

## PE Kit

As a new year resolution, we ask that all families ensure that children have their full and correct PE kit in school every day. This includes correctly fitting footwear.

In recent weeks there have been more and more children without correct PE kit and this is restricting learning.

If you are having difficulty providing your child with PE Kit, please come and talk to staff so that we may offer support.

Any children with pierced ears should have earrings removed at home on PE days as no earrings should be worn during PE lessons for Health and Safety reasons. Also all long hair should be tied up and away from the face so that it does not obscure vision.

## Head Lice

Every school in the country, at some point, will have children who suffer an outbreak of Head lice. Edith Cavell is no exception. To this end we ask that parents are extremely vigilant and check their child's hair on a weekly basis. Combing with a small toothed comb is advised to check and treat an outbreak.



Advice from the NHS advises that the whole family be checked regularly and treated if an outbreak is detected in any family member.

To help limit the spread of head lice, advice is that any long or shoulder length hair be tied up during the school day. We encourage all parents and children to comply with this advice.

School has a small number of head lice combs available for purchase.

## Attendance


