A note from Miss Cooke

As the end of term fast approaches this Friday 17th July, it is an opportunity to inform parents about some changes that are taking place in school and also remind parents about arrangements for September and how they can support their children to be ready to return to school on Monday 7th September 2020.

Parents are reminded that they can collect their child's end of year report from the school office. Details of which new class for September your child will be moving into is included in the report. Any reports not collected by Friday 17th July will be retained until children return to school in September.

If at any point you suspect that any child or family member is displaying signs of Covid 19 – they should not attend school. But you should inform school of the reason for their absence and make arrangements for all family members to take a Covid 19 test.

The symptoms of Covid 19 are:-

- **high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Arrangements for September

We will be **maintaining the one-way systems around the outside and inside of the school**. This will again help to maintain social distancing and prevent certain areas becoming pinch points. While school staff will continue to be a visible presence at the start and end of the school day, **please, please, please** set a good example to your children and other parents by maintaining social distancing when on the school premises and respect the one-way system and follow it even if school staff are not present. **We would also ask that parents try to wait away from the natural thoroughfare and path around the school** so that all parents can easily maintain social distancing when moving around the school.

We will be **maintaining the staggered start and end times to the school day**. This will mean that the number of children and parents accessing the school site at any one time will be reduced, will prevent crowding and allow parents to stand socially distanced outside all classrooms. We are aware that for some families they may have siblings with different start and end times to the school day. We would ask you to work with us to accommodate these different start and end of school day times to ensure that we can maintain social distancing and avoid congestion in cloakrooms and toilets when washing hands as the children come into school.

Breakfast Club and After School Club will resume from Monday 7th September. Places **must** be pre-booked and paid for via the Parent Pay portal prior to the date on which wrap around care is required.

From the start of the Autumn Term on Monday 7th September, children may bring their book bag or school bag to school and we ask that children:-

- return to wearing full school uniform, including school shoes.
- bring a named water bottle to school each day
- have available, every day, a full PE kit
- bring packed lunches in named packed lunch boxes or bags
- bring a healthy snack in a **small** bag or box
- resume homework tasks and reading at home

We will resume sending reading books home for parents to support the development of reading skills. When the reading books are returned to school they will be stored and unused for 72 hours prior to them being returned to use for another child to access. This is in line with the guidance on use of shared resources.

School dinners should be paid for in the usual way, via the Parent Pay portal. If you wish your child to have daily school milk, this can be paid for via the Cool Milk link on the school web site.

Social Distancing

The following measure will remain in place at the school at the start of the Autumn term to ensure good standards of hygiene and do all we can to try and prevent and spread of the virus.

- Children will be reminded regularly, throughout the day about social distancing
- The start and finish times of each year group that is in school will be different.
- Children will sit at desks all facing the front of the classroom to avoid sitting across from another child
- Children will have their own 'kit' in a named zip bag to avoid sharing resources – no child should bring their own stationary from home
- Shared resources such as laptops will be wiped down after each use
- Playtimes and lunchtimes will be staggered and separate. The school field will be divided in half with a 'No mans land' section in the middle. Trim trail equipment will NOT be available.
- There will be NO whole school assemblies.
- At lunch time, children will only sit on one side of the tables and so avoid facing other children across the table. Tables and chairs will be disinfected between groups of children using them

These email addresses will **NOT** be monitored over the summer holidays and should only be used from Monday 7th September.
