School Social Media Accounts

The school is looking to launch school Facebook, Instagram and Twitter accounts in the next couple of weeks.

We hope to use these social media accounts to share with parent's information, events and reminders about things that are happening in school.

These social media accounts will be closely monitored by the school and we hope they will prove to be popular.

No social media accounts should be used as an opportunity to make a complaint, attack an individual or moan about a situation in school. If any parent has a concern they

MUST continue to approach the school in the same ways that they do at present.

One of the most important parts of e-safety that we teach to the children is that an individual should not express something on line that they would not be prepared to say to a person's face. We expect parents to support us with this message and adhere to it in relation to the school social media accounts.



A drink to accompany a packed meal.

If your child brings a packed lunch to school each day, you may have received a note in their lunch box asking you to provide a drink for your child to have with their lunch.

The reason for this is over 50 children each day do not have drink to accompany their packed lunch. The school have been purchasing disposable plastic cups and providing these to children who do not have a drink with their packed lunch.

These plastic cups go into land fill when they go in the bin and so are contributing to global warming. The plastic cups are also expensive for the school to purchase.

We are aware that most parents provide their children with a water bottle each day and so may be asking why their child cannot drink from this at lunchtime. Water bottles are stored in the classroom and the practical operational implications of groups of children or individual returning to their classrooms to collect water bottle is not practical. You may also be considering why can't the school use reusable cups to provide water to children eating packed lunches. Reusable cups would require washing and this would take staff out of the classroom supporting children.

Therefore, we ask that parents ensure they provide a reusable drinks bottle with their child's packed lunch, to ensure that they have a drink with their packed lunch.

I hope this explains why your child has had a note in their lunch box asking you to provide a drink to accompany their lunch.



Safeguarding at home



Staff have recently updated their safeguarding training. As part of this training we were alerted research carried out by the Internet Watch Foundation about how increased access to the internet by children through lockdown has resulted in the escalation of exploitation of children.

I would urge parents to read this article and consider the circumstances in which their children have the opportunity to access the internet away from adult supervision.
