A note from Miss Cooke

In some respects, I can't believe I am writing the June newsletter as I can't believe we are already in June, but in other ways, as this has been such a disrupted school year, I will not be upset when we get to the end of the term, so we can start to plan for next year, which will hopefully be more settled.

After such a disrupted school year, that none of us could have envisioned in September, I am incredibly proud of all the children, parents and staff in the way that they have adapted to almost any situation that has arisen. The way that children have continued their learning journey, be it in school or at home at such short notice, is testament to their flexibility and resilience. The new ways of working and learning that children, parents and staff have developed since March 2020 are immense and continue to develop and adapt to the ever changing situation.

After the government announcement about current restrictions remaining in place until at least 19th July, all current provision in and around school will remain in place until the end of the school year on Thursday 22nd July. We will be keeping in place staggered start and end of the school day, to limit the number of parents accessing the site at any one time. We ask that **parents continue to wear a face mask** when they are on the school site. We also ask that parents maintain social distancing when waiting before or at the end of the school day.

We will update parents in the last week of term, if we have been provided with further guidance that will apply in September. If we have not received updated guidance by the end of the school year, we will be in touch, via email, on Friday 3rd September to update on start and end of school day times. Please ensure that we hold your up to date email address.

As restrictions on the number of people gathering together remain in place, it will not be possible for parents to attend our sports mornings this year. The sports mornings will still go ahead for the children to enjoy, especially as they did not take place last year, but it will not be possible for parents to attend due to current government rules about the number of people gathering together, even outside, being limited to 30.

Infection rates in Bedford are still high in comparison to the rest of the country, so it is important that we all abide by government guidelines to try and prevent the spread of the virus. We are all looking forward to life returning to some sort of 'normality.' But must still be vigilant and careful with social interactions. Please remember the government advice – Hands, Face, Space, Fresh Air

Road works on Clapham Road roundabout starting on 28th June 2021

Many of you living in the area local to school, may have received notification as the school did, about the start of major roadworks on the stretch of road between the two roundabouts near Sainsbury's.

This work is due to start on Monday 28th June and is the start of a five phase piece of road improvement.

This disruption is likely to have an impact on all people who travel to school in a vehicle and we will not know the ongoing impact until any restrictions have been in place for a period of time.

Please bear these road works in mind when planning a journey to bring or collect children to and from school.



Sun hats and Sun Cream



In the very nice sunny weather that we have been having, please ensure that children have named sun hats available to them in school for the day. Also, please ensure that you have applied sun cream to your children before they come into school.

This is really important in keeping children safe in the sun. The children are outside after eating their lunch in the strong midday sun. While some shade is available on the school field this is limited and many children want to take advantage of being out side and play rather than keeping to the shade.

It is also vital that your child has a water bottle at school every day. This should be filled with pure water – no juice, cordial or flavored water. Keeping correctly hydrated in hot weather is important and the brain cannot function correctly to learn if it is not hydrated.

For the school to keep providing disposable cups to sometimes half a class, who do not have a water bottle, is not good for the planet and is an additional cost to the school.

Sports Days and Race for Life

Sports days will be taking place on week beginning 12th July. These will be internal events only and as previously explained **parents will not be able to attend**. Please send your child to school in their PE kits on the following days and ensure that they bring their uniform to school to change in to after their sports day. Children **must also have their water bottles available on these days**.

The whole school will have the opportunity to take part in Cancer Research's Race for Life on Friday 16th July. We ask that any child wishing to take part makes a minimum £2 donation via Parent Pay or a cash donation on the day. The payment item will be available on Parent Pay from 1st July until the end of 16th July.



Picnic lunches



On each Thursday in July, 1st, 8th and 15th, the kitchen will be providing themed picnic packed lunches as the midday meal. The children thoroughly enjoy these events and it allows the children to sit outside to eat if the weather allows. During these events, social distancing and bubbles, will be maintained along with hygiene standards.

Ordering New Uniform for September

If you are considering purchasing new school sweatshirts or cardigans for the start of the new term in September, please use the Parent Pay Shop on the school website.

You do not require a Parent Pay log in for this feature, it can be accessed direct from the school website and you use a credit or debit card to pay directly for what you order.

When you order online in this way, the items can then be collected from the school office or sent home with your child.

Please ensure that you put your child's name in any new school wear so it can be returned to them if it becomes lost.

Scooters and bikes around the school site



Parents and children are well aware of the need to refrain from riding bikes and scooters with the school grounds and in the main comply.

I ask that any adult or child riding a bike or scooter are especially vigilant when they are riding their devices in the areas around the school, especially along Slade Walk at the busy times before and after school to avoid accidents.

There is a current trend of owning and using e-scooters. Parents and children should be aware that *"The only e-scooters that can be used on public roads are those rented as part of government-backed trials. If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it on private land and not on public roads, cycle lanes or pavements. This is because e-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs) so they are treated as motor vehicles. As such, if they are used on a road, pavement or public place they are subject to the same legal requirements as any motor vehicle."*

Internet Watch Foundation - Online Grooming New Campaign



A new IWF safety campaign aims to help parents have conversations with their children about keeping their 'door' closed to child sexual abusers. The campaign includes a booklet for parents, explaining the risks, explaining why children are vulnerable, and suggests practice steps that parents can take.

The mnemonic used in the campaign is TALK:

TALK to your child about online sexual abuse. Start the conversation – and listen to their concerns.

AGREE ground rules about the way you use technology as a family.

LEARN about the platforms and apps your child loves. Take an interest in their online life.

KNOW how to use tools, apps and settings that can help to keep your child safe online.
