### A note from Miss Cooke

As we approach the last few days of the school year, reflection on the past year is understandable. It has been quite a year – again! I am incredibly proud of the way in which the children, parents and staff have adapted so quickly to the ever changing situation; how after the national lockdown and bubble closures children have returned to school with renewed vigour and enthusiasm for learning. But now we are all, children, parents and staff ready for a holiday, in the hope that when we return in September, we can return to some sort of ‘normality’.

Following the Prime Minister confirming that Covid restrictions will formally end on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July, he also advised that ‘people should still wear a face covering, even if it is not required by law.’ As we are so close to the end of the summer term, I request that parents continue to observe the one-way system, wear face coverings and maintain social distancing on the school site. We will maintain the staggered start and end to the school day, until the end of the summer term on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July.

When we return to school on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September, I would hope that we can return to the whole school starting school at the same time, children and staff mixing outside their current bubbles and no requirement to wear a face mask on the school site. These changes are dependent on the local infection rate, government and local advice at the time. I will communicate with families on 3<sup>rd</sup> September to fully update on what arrangements will be for the return to school on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September.

Bedford Borough remains a COVID-19 Enhanced Response Area and infection rates are still high in comparison to the rest of the country, so it is important that we all abide by government guidelines to try and prevent the spread of the virus. We must still be vigilant and careful with social interactions. Please remember the government advice – Hands, Face, Space, Fresh Air.

Over the summer holidays, class email accounts will not be monitored. When your child moves into their new class in September, you will be advised of the class email address for your child’s new class teacher. All other communication should be sent to the school email address, ([office@ecls.org.uk](mailto:office@ecls.org.uk)) that will be monitored weekly over the summer holidays.

### Last Day of Term – Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2021

A reminder that parents have the opportunity to collect their children early on the last day of term if they wish. **Children can remain at school until normal end of school day if parents wish.**

Y5 and 6 children will not be allowed to leave at the earlier finish time unless parents have completed the online permission form that can be accessed in the following link <https://forms.gle/Ea8CcstRgZtKdFwSA>



There will be just two points at which children may be collected or dismissed, either the early finish time indicated in the table below, **or** at the normal end of day from their collection/dismissal point listed – **not** at any other time. Parents may collect their child/ren at the early finish time from their normal class. Any children not collected at the early finish time, will be cared for in their bubbles until the normal end of day.

### **End of Day Collection/Dismissal Points**

(For children staying until the normal end of day)

- **Reception and Nursery** should be collected from their **classrooms as normal**
- **KS1** should be collected from **Jade classroom**
- **LKS2** should be collected from **Garnet classroom**
- **UKS2** will be dismissed from **Quartz classroom**

### **GEMS – Afterschool Club**

The after school club will be available **until 4.30pm on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July** and bookings should be made in the normal way via Parent Pay.

### **Free White Rose Maths Workbook**

In school we follow the White Rose maths scheme for our maths teaching.

## Get Epic

To support children to continue reading over the summer holidays, we have been advised that children will continue to have access to the class Get Epic website over the holidays.



There will be a slight change to the number of books that can be accessed outside regular school hours. Children will still be able to access multiple books during regular school hours, but outside regular school hours they will be limited to one book per day. Codes for current classes should be used and new codes for when children move into their new classes we would hope to issue in September.

## Summer reading challenge



Each year Bedfordshire libraries run a Summer Reading Challenge and this year is no different.

Wild World Heroes is the theme of the Summer Reading Challenge this year. The challenge started last Saturday 10th July and runs until Saturday 11th September.

Children can join the library at any Bedford Borough Library and the Mobile Library. It is free to join and children pick up their Wild World Heroes Poster when they join and collect rewards for reading library books. A reading challenge bookmark was recently sent home for children to use to mark their place in a book that they read and would count towards the reading challenge.

## Holidays abroad

Some families may be considering taking a holiday abroad over the summer holidays. As we have seen in the past few days, the governments traffic light system for holiday destinations can change very quickly. Children in Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 return to school on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September. Any absence from school due to the need to isolate after a holiday will be considered as unauthorised absence and will negatively affect your child's attendance for the whole school year. It may also result in involvement from the Education Welfare Service.



## Breakfast and After School Clubs

In September, all year groups will be starting school at the same time, classroom doors will open at **8.45am** and close again at 8.55am, therefore any attendance at Breakfast and After School Club will be chargeable. Any parents wishing for their children to be cared for before 8.45am or after 3.30pm (Rec, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4) or 3.40pm (Y5 & Y6) will need to book and pay for sessions in breakfast and after school clubs using Parent Pay.

## E- Scooters – Message from Bedfordshire Police

Bedfordshire police have seen an increase in complaints from members of the public, and local councillors around the use of e-scooters in public. Some of these relating specifically to students riding them to school, or parents riding them whilst carrying small children.



We are therefore asking for the assistance of every school in the borough to share a few key messages with you all, in the hope we can prevent this from continuing and possibly save lives.

It is against the law to use e-scooters on public land unless it is part of a government scheme. The scheme has various measures in place to maximise the safety of their use, with the long-term view of seeing how they can be incorporated into UK law.

At present, Bedford is not part of this trial, and to date there are no plans for us to be part of it in the future. Therefore, **riding them in public is illegal.**

We have carried out several local campaigns on social media, which has been shared by local newspapers and we have been proactively stopping riders and providing them with educational literature around riding e-scooters. Our aim has been to educate riders not to use them on public land, as we are well aware some people have genuinely been unaware of the laws around their use.

There have also been several e-scooter stories in the national media, featuring on Sky and BBC news in an endeavour to get the message out to as many people as possible.

As of the 5th July we will be moving out of the educational phase, to one of enforcement when dealing with e-scooters, hence my contact with you all.

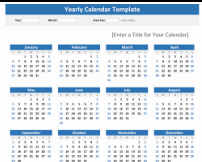
Our plea is this, we really do not want to see any young people affected by this, if they were to be prosecuted they could end up with points on their licence before they even have one and this could really impact them getting a licence later on in their adult life. Points remain on a licence for 3 years, and for insurance reasons they show for 4 years. This means they could apply for a provisional licence and already have points waiting for them, or even worse they could be banned before they even apply for one.

This is something we absolutely want to avoid, so please if your child has an e-scooter don't allow them to ride it on public land. We genuinely do not want them to be prosecuted, and have their expensive equipment seized.

Please remember:

- It is illegal to ride e-scooters on public land.
- It is only currently legal to use these on private land with the landowner's permission, or in areas running a government scheme. The e scooter however needs to be rented as part of that scheme due to liability insurance.
- An e-scooter is classed as a motor vehicle and if you ride one in public it has the same expectations on you as it would do when driving a car. i.e. the need to have insurance, MOT, tax etc.
- If you ride your e-scooter in public you risk having your e-scooter seized, being fined up to £300 and receiving six points on your licence. This will be the case whether you have a licence or not.

### **Change of Training Day**



After seeing the Bedford Borough proposed academic calendar for next year, we have applied and have been granted the permission to change the date of one of the proposed training days next academic year.

For ease for parents, a training day will start each new term and will not take place after a half term holiday.

The four training days for the academic year 2021 -2022 will take place on:

Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2021

Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> January 2022

Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2022
