A message from Miss Cooke

I want to start this newsletter by say **THANK YOU** on a couple of fronts.

Firstly, THANK YOU to parents and children who made donations to our Harvest Festival appeal at the end of September. We donated the food collection to the Bedford Food Bank and have already received a letter of thanks from them. The letter and certificate explains that as a school we donated 109.5KG of food which equates to 260 meals for those in need. That is amazing. Thank you.

Secondly, I want to say THANK YOU to all the parents that have attended parent consultation meetings, either in person or virtually, this week. (Parents of children in Reception, don't worry, you have not missed consultations, Reception consultation evening will take place after half term.) It has been fantastic to reconnect with parents and to be able to share how well the children have settled back into school and learning as well as discussing how parents can support their child's learning at home. In that true partnership, school and home are working hand in hand to enable all children to achieve success with their learning and supporting all aspects of a child's learning and development.

Much as we really wish that the disruption and threat from Covid 19 had gone away permanently, it is not the case. In school we are maintaining the enhanced cleaning, and hand washing, but have relaxed the bubble and one way systems at present. We have had isolated cases of children testing positive in the school, but have not reached a threshold where control measures would have to be re-introduced.

Thank you to parents who have helped to keep our infection rates low, by being understanding and taking their children for PCR tests if they have become unwell with any of the recognised symptoms of Covid 19. This is helping families inside and outside of school in keeping safe.

We do recognise that it is really difficult to be certain if a child is feeling unwell with a cold or suffering with symptoms of Covid, but a PCR test confirms.

A quick reminder that children should attend school on **Monday 1**st **November. This is the first day back to school after the half term break.**

Coats



As the weather is getting colder and wetter, all children are required to bring a coat to school **EVERY DAY**.

We will always try to take the children outside at break and lunchtimes, including when it is slightly raining. If your child does not have a coat, they will get wet and have to sit in wet sweatshirts for the rest of the school day which is not good for them.

Parent Pay

The school's online payment portal, Parent Pay, is a quick and easy to pay for most costs, charges or donations to the school. From charity



donations to paying for a trip, school dinners or breakfast and after school club. Please remember to allocate your payment to the correct payment item you are paying for.

We have updated Parent Pay so that breakfast club and after school club can be booked and payed for via the portal up to midnight the night before a session.

We hope that this will reduce the number of ad hoc sessions that children are accessing.

While breakfast club and after school club are always there if needed as an emergency option to parents, it is important that children are pre booked into sessions so that we can ensure that we have the correct staffing rations and food available to be able to safely accommodate any emergency bookings that come in during the day.

Packed Lunches

Children bringing packed lunches, MUST NOT bring any kind of nut product, which includes peanut butter, as part of their packed lunch. We have a number of children in school who have allergies to nuts and especially peanuts.



Packed lunches should also be a healthy meal and so should not have packets of sweets or large chocolate bars or large amounts of chocolate. Midday supervisors regularly check lunch boxes, and so will speak to your child about the content of their lunch box if it is considered to contain a high amount of unsuitable or unhealthy items.

In contrast, grapes are a very healthy option to have as part of a packed lunch, but we ask that any children in Reception or KS1 who have grapes as part of their packed lunch or playtime snack, that the grapes are cut length ways. This is to try and prevent chocking.



Year 6s Virtual SATs Information Evening

It has come round to that time in the year that we would, in normal circumstances, be inviting you in to school for an information session about the upcoming Year 6 SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) that your child will be taking in May 2021. Due to rising COVID infection rates in the borough, we propose to hold a **virtual** information session on **Tuesday 19**th **October 2021 at 5.00pm.**

Children should bring their money to school if they wish to take part in this appeal and items will be brought to each class in each phase of the school.

Christmas Performances

We very much want to return to inviting parents into school to watch their children perform in different events.

We have planned to present two Christmas performances this year.

KS1 children will hope to present a Christmas Nativity and LKS2 a concert of Christmas songs.

These plans will be dependent on the Covid 19 infection rate in Bedford and the school at the start of December. The proposed



performances will be carefully risk assessed and it may be necessary to cancel these plans if on the balance of risk, it is considered too great a threat of spreading Covid 19.

Much as we do not want to disappoint parents or children, we have to be mindful of the wider risks to the school community, especially that close to Christmas.

Keeping Children Safe On Line

At parent's evenings, there was a range of information being displayed on the big screen in the hall. The most important thing that parents can do is have honest and open conversations with their children about the sites and apps that they are using and their activities online.

- If your child is playing or seeing parents or older sibling playing adult rated games?

They are seeing a level of violence not recommended for them.

Would you take them to the cinema to see an 18+ rated film?

Lego have released a new, free online safety resource for parents and their children called Build and Talk. It's a question and answer story game to allow parents to talk to their child about digital safety and wellbeing.

Apple Family Share - Controls & Settings guide

Family Sharing makes it easy for you and up to five family members to share Apple Books, and App Store purchases, photo album, family calendar, an Apple Music family plan, and an iCloud storage plan.



It is also useful if you have children as you can set up tools such as 'Ask to Buy',

locate their devices, set screen time limits for specific apps and much more. A parent or guardian can also set up an Apple ID account for a child under 13 years' old.

Attendance


