# Newsletter - February 2022

## A message from Miss Cooke

I can't believe that I am writing my February newsletter already and we are at the end of February! The year is speeding by. One positive is the lighter mornings and evenings; it makes it feel that the spring is on its way.

Thank you to all parents who have supported their children to obtain sponsors for our sponsored skip. The children have really enjoyed learning and practising their skipping skills. Now that the children have all completed the sponsored skip, please could sponsorship money and donations be forwarded to the school by Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March. Parents are able to use ParentPay to return the money raised or a donation to the school.

There have been many changes in the past few weeks to the advice from local and central government around responses to Covid 19.

I have attached the updated flow chart from Bedford Borough to this newsletter. While the legal requirement to isolate following a positive test for Covid has been removed, the **advice** is to still isolate following a positive PCR or LFT test.

As a school we will continue to follow this advice and if a child is displaying Covid symptoms, we will ask parents to collect their child, complete a PCR test, and inform the school of the results of that test. If the test results are negative and the child does not have a temperature, they may return to school. If the results of the test are positive, they should isolate at home. On day five, they can take an LFT test and if that test is negative, take another LFT test 24 hours later. If the second test is negative, then the child can return to school.

We will be continuing to follow this advice as we want to keep all members of the school community as safe as possible and avoid spreading Covid 19 as much as possible. In school, for the time being, we will be maintaining consistent groupings, the other arrangements that we have in place and will continue to keep the local situation and under review.

For the upcoming SEN parent's evenings, Parents will have the option to attend in person or via a virtual meeting. Any parents choosing a face to face meeting will be asked to wear a face mask when they come into the school building.

By working together, we can continue to keep as many children and staff in school as possible and continue to keep children learning.

### Price Increase for Breakfast and After School Club

In light of recent well publicised increases in the cost of basic goods and services, it has been necessary to review the charges for our breakfast and after school clubs.

We have not raised our charges for these clubs for two and a half years, but in the current set of price rises nationally, it cannot be avoided.

From after the Easter holidays, when we return to school for the summer term on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April 2022, the new prices are outlined below.

The price rises constitute a 50p per week increase for Breakfast club and either a 50p or £1 per week increase for after school club depending on one or two-hour booking. We hope that you agree this still constitutes value for money.

### <u>Change to Term Dates – Additional Bank Holiday for Queen's Platinum Jubilee</u> <u>School Closed Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2022</u>

To help celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this year, an additional bank holiday has been put into the National calendar for 2022. As the day assigned as the additional bank holiday has been placed within the May Half term holiday, schools have been asked to add the bank holiday into their school term dates.

The Governors have agreed that the additional day of holiday will be the final day of the school year on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2022.

Therefore, the final day of the school year, the final day that the children will be in school before the summer holidays will be Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022. **The school will be closed on Friday 22st July 2022.**

OBE (a police officer and school head teacher). They recognised the necessity for police to share timely information with schools in order that children can be supported at school following Domestic Abuse Incidents they may have witnessed or been impacted by.

From 21/02/22 – Operation Encompass will be launched across Bedford Borough and Edith Cavell will be part of the scheme. This is a joint initiative between Bedfordshire Police and Bedford Borough Children's Services and its aim is to provide schools with information relating to domestic abuse incidents that have impacted pupils at the school, as quickly as possible so that the school can provide appropriate support for children impacted by Domestic Abuse.

## Eligibility to Free School Meals.(FSM)

We are very aware that some families may be facing changing financial circumstances due to the Coronavirus outbreak. If, through change of circumstances, you feel your child may have become eligible for free school meals, we would urge you to consider applying for this benefit. If any family are eligible, even for a short time, the school will receive financial support for six years, so any applications that are successful will support you and the school.

#### **COVID 19 Advice - Reminder**

No child should attend school if they are displaying any of the symptoms of Covid 19 which are:-

- high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

An upset stomach, headache, sore throat or unusual fatigue are early warning signs of Covid 19. Please look out for these and if your child is displaying any of these symptoms, please get them tested to keep everyone in the school safe.

We have a number of vulnerable parents with serious health conditions who could be very seriously affected if their child contracts Covid 19. If we are all vigilant, we keep everyone safe.

If your child starts to display these symptoms, we ask that you inform the school why your child is not in school and obtain a test for Covid 19. Once the results of the test are obtained, we ask that you communicate this to the school.

The Bedford Borough flowchart to assist parents in making decisions about when to send a child to school is attached to the end of this newsletter and displayed on the school web site.

If you need to communicate with the school office, we would prefer if this could be done via phone or email and as this would be preferable to physically visiting the office. ## A message from the Governors



Did you know that the Governors are responsible for overseeing the management of the school? We do this by working with the head teacher and other staff in the school, contributing to a school strategy, policy, budgeting and staffing decisions. We operate both as a full governing body and in sub-committees focussing on areas, such as Finance and Health and Safety, Personnel and Wellbeing and the Curriculum Committee. In general, Governors are either co-opted for their skills or join as parent governors, valued for their passion for the school and the parent perspective.

We plan to give you an update from each committee and the Finance and Health and Safety is the first.

In this committee, we are responsible for setting the school budget, considering the school's strategic plan, and making sure that the school does not overspend. One of our roles is to ensure that money (including pupil premium) is spent effectively to deliver the best possible education to the children. We also have a role in ensuring that the school provides a safe environment for staff and children, by reviewing policies and expenditure proposals. We are fortunate to have a Health and Safety professional on the committee, who undertakes termly H&S walks through the school and has provided useful advice during the COVID pandemic. The current members of the committee include the Head teacher, the School Business Manager, the Committee Chair (a qualified accountant), the Chair of Governors (a former senior teacher), a parent governor and the further co-opted governor (H&S professional).

Parents should talk to the Headteacher, Miss. Cooke, if they are interested in becoming a governor in the future or want to know more about the role of the governors.
