# A message from Miss Cooke

As we return for the summer term I want to share some of the plans that we have for the term.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022, most of the Covid 19 specific guidance for education was relaxed. This means that we have been able to remove a number of measures that we had in place across the school.

You may have noticed that the barrier dividing the KS2 playground has been re-located and so the whole of KS2 are now able to play together. Phase groups will now be mixing in whole school, in-person assemblies, and at lunchtimes. There are certain measures that we have kept in place, including regular handwashing, availability, and use of sanitising hand gel. Staff, visitors, and parents are not expected to wear face coverings going forward, but may choose to do so if they wish. We certainly hope to be able to welcome visitors and parents back into school this term.

Guidance from Public Health and the DfE for schools moving forward from the pandemic is '*Children or adults who are unwell* **and have a high temperature** should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to their education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.' Therefore, we would ask that if your child has a temperature, where you may have given them Calpol, or other similar medicines, that you keep them at home to recover and feel better before they return to school. We understand that this may inconvenience working parents, but if all parents follow this advice and children who are unwell do not attend school, there is less chance of them infecting other children in school who may then become unwell. If the school judges that your child is unwell and not well enough to be in school, we will make contact with parents and ask for children to be collected from school, as we have always done.

One event that we wish to resume this week is inviting parents into class on a Friday morning to read with their children. When the doors open at 8.45am, parents are invited to come into the classroom, **sanitise their hands as they come in**, and share a storybook with their child. When the bell rings at 8.55am we ask that parents leave the classroom so that the formal school day can start. This will start next Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

We have set a number of dates for events in school, please look at and note the dates at the end of this newsletter.

As this is the final term of the school year, there will be a number of formal assessments taking place in most year groups. Your child's progress will be reported to you in their end-of-year report. In order to support your child to achieve as well as they possibly can, we would ask that you ensure your child is in school every day, continue to read regularly with your child at home, and support them to complete any homework assignments set. If your child is struggling to complete any homework set, please either speak to or email your child's class teacher to discuss the situation.

Just a reminder that school will be **closed on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2022** as this is the May Day Bank Holiday.

## Naming School sweatshirts and cardigans

As we are, hopefully moving into some nicer weather, please could you ensure that your child's name is clearly visible in their school sweatshirt or cardigan. If you labelled them at the start of the school year it is very unlikely that their name is still visible after multiple washes. Please re-label each of your child's sweatshirts as this will make it much easier to ensure that when children take off their sweatshirts they can be returned to the correct

owners. Please check each month that the name that you have written on the sweatshirts continues to be visible.

#### School Dinners – Sandwich option

After consultation with the Pupil elected School Council, the kitchen will be offering an additional meal choice at lunchtime. Children will now be able to select a sandwich option for their main meal. Children will still also have the choice of a meat, vegetarian or Jacket Potato option as well as the sandwich option. Children will be able to choose the sandwich meal option each morning in school when they make their meal choice. There will be a different filling option on each day that the children may choose from. Monday – Cheese

Tuesday – Ham or Cheese Wednesday – Egg or Cheese Thursday – Ham or Cheese Friday – Tuna or Cheese

As part of the sandwich option, children in KS1 and lower KS2 will receive two slices of filled bread. Children in Upper Key Stage 2 will receive three slices of filled bread. All children choosing the sandwich option will also receive crudités and then whatever is the pudding option or fruit.

Parents should note that their child may choose the sandwich option for lunch each day and so take this into account when planning evening meals, that their child may not have had a hot meal at school.

# <u>Pyjamarama</u>



On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May, we will be taking part in Pyjamarama Day. On this day the children are invited to come to school in their pyjamas (with sensible shoes and dressed warmly enough to be appropriate for the weather on the day) Over the day the children will take part in activities based around reading and sharing stories with

each other. We will ask for a £1 donation on this day that will go to The Book Trust who organises the day and are the UK's largest reading charity. The Book Trust supports children and








#### Accelerated Reader

Over the summer term you will start to see some changes to our reading scheme and the way that we label, store and use our reading books. For children in Year 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 we will be phasing out the coloured



book bands system and moving towards a new reading system called Accelerated Reader. Accelerated Reader is a system where children complete their home reading and then, back in school, go on to answer quizzes about what they have read.

For Accelerated Reader to be successful, our reading books will be organised in a different way. Rather than being labelled as colours, reading books will start to be organised by a numbering system called a ZPD number. ZPD stands for Zone of Proximal Development which refers to the difference between what a learner can do without help and what he or she can achieve with guidance and encouragement.

This move to using Accelerated Reader is something that will take a period of time to achieve fully, and may impact the availability of some reading books during the changeover, so please bear with us as we undertake this project.

Children in Reception, Year 1, and some children in Year 2, will continue to read the phonically decodable books and the early reading books as they do now.

The book worm badges and Golden Ticket rewards will remain in place and continue as we take on Accelerated Reader.

We will share further information about Accelerated Reader as we move through the transition process.

#### <u>Stranger danger – Clever never goes</u>



As the days are getting longer and children have the opportunity to be outside for longer, please take the opportunity to have that conversation with your children about being safe and aware of where they are and who they might be talking to. We talk so much about ensuring children are safe online, but it is just as important for children to make sensible decisions about their actions and who they interact

with in person.

CLEVER NEVER GOES is the new, child-friendly lesson that teaches children how to stay safe from abduction when they are outside (e.g. walking to or from school), or online.

#### Parental Supervision

It has been noticed on a number of occasions that children in Year 4 or below are not being accompanied to school each morning and are being left on the playground before school without suitable supervision.

The safety, behaviour and well-being of the children remains with parents until 8.45am each morning. This means that all children below Y5 should be brought to school every morning and parents **MUST** wait with their children and see them go



in to school safely. Any parents who are not complying with this are being neglectful to their children. Should parents require children to be supervised by school staff before 8.45am, they can make a booking for Breakfast club that operates from 8am every morning. Details of breakfast club can be found on the school web site or from the school office. Any children below Year 4 who are seen arriving at school unsupervised by an **adult**, will be noted and parents contacted. If the situation continues parents will be expected to attend a meeting with Miss Cooke to discuss the situation.
