# Last Day of Term - Thursday 21st July 2022

We would like to give parents the opportunity to collect their children early on the afternoon of the last day of term, Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022. Children may be collected at **1.45pm**.

Any child may stay in school until the normal end of the school day if parents are working or they do not wish to collect them early.

# Please note: Year 5 and Year 6 children will not be allowed to leave early without the school receiving a completed form from parents.

Parents may collect their child/ren at the early finish time from their normal class. Any children not collected at the early finish time will be cared for in their phase groups until the normal end of day.

There will be just two points at which children may be collected or dismissed, either the early finish time indicated in the table below **or** at the normal end of day from their collection/dismissal point listed – **not** at any other time.

# End of Day Collection/Dismissal Points - (For children staying until the normal end of day)

- Reception and Nursery should be collected from their classrooms as normal
- KS1 should be collected from Jade classroom
- LKS2 should be collected from Garnet classroom
- UKS2 will be dismissed from Quartz classroom

#### Update on parking and the bus stops on Manton Lane

In the May newsletter, I reported that I had repeatedly attempted to make contact with Bedford Borough to discuss the removal of the layby on Manton Lane and the inconvenience that this is causing to parents. I had a meeting with an officer from Bedford Borough Traffic Management department at the start of June and they have agreed that, following a further consultation process, some of the layby will be reinstated. The layby will not be as large as it was previously, but it should allow some parents to park for a short period of time. There will be a waiting time limit on the new layby. The two bus stops will remain and anyone waiting or parking in these designated bays are liable to be fined.

I have been assured that the layby area will be in place by the start of September. If it is not, I will again start noisily asking questions to Bedford Borough.

# **Platinum Jubilee Book**

#### **Increase to Price of School Meals**

We have been informed by Caterlink that the cost of school meals will rise from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022 when the children return for the Autumn term.

Due to the cost of living increases across all areas of society it is necessary to raise the charges for Breakfast and Afterschool club. From September the new prices will be.

Please ensure that when you add money to your parent pay account you allocate the funds to a payment item and book the specific days that you require places at Breakfast and Afterschool club. Parents are reminded that all places should be booked and paid for in advance. If a pre-booking is not received, sessions will be charged at the Ad hock rate.

If you are considering purchasing new school sweatshirts or cardigans for the start of the new term in September, please use the Parent Pay Shop on the school website. You do not require a Parent Pay log-in for this feature, it can be accessed directly from the school website and you use a credit or debit card to pay directly for what you order.



When you order online in this way, the items can then be collected from the school office or sent home with your child.

Please ensure that you put your child's name in any new school wear so it can be returned to them if it becomes lost.

# <u>On-line Safety – Article from Alan Mackenzie – e-safety advisor</u> Snapchat - Meet Up (New Feature)

When Snap Maps became a new feature a few years ago there was widespread outrage, particularly that it was turned on by default, and users were not notified of this. Snapchat has now added another layer onto this feature called Meet Up which pairs with Apple Maps or Google Maps to give exact directions to a person, as long as they are Snapchat Friends.

For adults, even older teens, I can see that some would find this a very useful feature. However, I find this utterly frightening when it comes to children. I advise parents to check the privacy settings, including Ghost Mode, on their child's Snapchat account. You can find details HERE




# **Attendance**
