## A message from Miss Cooke

This half term has flown by but it has been an incredibly busy half term and so the half term holiday fast approaching is welcome to the children and staff. School will close on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> May and will reopen on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

Over the past couple of weeks, I have written to you about school uniform and the school Golden Rules. In this newsletter I would like to expand on a different point that forms part of the Home School Agreement about collecting children on time from school.

Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 children finish school at 3.30pm and should be collected **at 3.30pm** from their class staff. Parents and carers of children in these year groups should be waiting for their children at this time. If you have more than one child to collect at 3.30pm, we are aware of siblings within school and the need to collect more than one child. If you do have more than one child to collect at 3.30pm.

Thank you to the majority of parents who are on time to collect their children at the end of the day, but we would ask that some parents make extra efforts to ensure that they are on time collecting their children each day. It may only be a few minutes late, but if it is a few minutes late every day, how would your boss feel if you were late for work every day? Or how would you feel at being expected to stay at work a few minutes every day?

If children are not collected at 3.30pm it could cause them to become anxious and worried. We understand that emergencies happen and situations may change within the school day. If this is the case and you are aware that you are going to be late collecting your children, we would ask that you contact the school office so that your child/ren and staff can be made aware.

We are also aware that finding places to park close to school can be a challenge and would encourage parents to ensure that they have the time to park a little way away from school and walk to the playground, while still being on time at 3.30pm to collect their children. Parents **should not use the staff car park** at the start and end of school sessions including at lunchtime when bringing children to Little Treasures.

Have a wonderful half term holiday and we look forward to seeing everyone back at 8.45am on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2023

#### **Uniform Ordering for September**



This term we are changing the way we order school uniform ready for the new school year in September.

If you wish to order any school branded products, such as sweatshirts, cardigans or bookbags, in readiness for September, please pre-order via the normal way on <u>Parent Pay by</u> <u>19th June 2023.</u>

Orders will be delivered in July – we will confirm the collection date as soon as the clothing company informs us.

Any pre-orders placed after 19th June 2023 will not be passed to the clothing company until we return in September, after the summer break and therefore will not be delivered to school in time for the start of the new school year. Unfortunately, as this is a very busy period for the clothing company, we cannot guarantee when we will receive the uniform, once the order has been placed with them.

As a school we will not be holding large stocks of school branded uniform in school and you will NOT be able to come into the school office to buy a new item of school branded uniform to take away with you there and then. So if you are wanting to purchase new school branded uniform in readiness for September, you **MUST** order by 19th June 2023.

Going forward, we will only be ordering school branded uniform once each half term. We will publish a date each half term for school branded uniform orders to be placed by and any orders received after that date will not be ordered until the next half term.

#### <u>PE Kit</u>



As we move further into the summer term, it is possible for more PE lessons to take place outside. It is important to ensure that children have the correct PE kit in school – **including correctly fitting plimsolls or trainers**. We are finding that many children do not have the correct footwear to enable them to safely take part in PE lessons. Part of changing for PE lessons is that all jewellery including earrings should be

removed. Please ensure that if your child is wearing earrings for school, they are able to remove those earrings themselves, or parents remove the earrings at home on days that PE takes place.

#### Sun Safety



As the summer term progresses we are seeing some increasingly sunny and warm days. In order for children to be safe in the sun, we ask that parents apply sun cream to their children before they come to school in the morning, but also that each child has a **named** sun hat available



that they can wear when out in the sun for lessons as well as playtimes. Also it is important that children have a water bottle available every day so that they can drink throughout the day and especially when they have been running around at playtimes.

### **Cancellation of Wraparound Care Clubs**

Now that our Care Clubs are becoming busier just a reminder about when to cancel a booking if you no longer need it.

Please note that if a booked session is cancelled within the cancellation period or your child is absent from school due to illness, it will be credited towards future sessions. The credit is held in your Parent Pay account.

To receive a credit, cancellations for GEMS After School Club must be made <u>before 9.30am</u> on the day of the session. Cancellations for Breakfast Club must be made <u>the day before</u> the session. Any sessions cancelled after these times will be charged.

#### Parent advice and support for Online Safety

#### XBox Gaming Safety Toolkit

Many children and young people will be using Xbox gaming stations at home and as such Microsoft have put together quite a comprehensive toolkit (a PDF document) for parents, children and young people that goes into quite a lot of depth, including parental controls, guidance for all ages, common safety risks, bullying, unwanted contact and more. There is also age-specific guidance (from 5 years upwards) and case studies.

The toolkit has been produced for gamers in Australia and New Zealand, but we can see no reason at all why this can't be used by any person in any country, the information is all the same regardless.


There's a second prize of a signed vinyl copy of Stormzy's album 'This What I Mean' too!
