## Newsletter – October 2023

## A message from Miss Cooke

The cold weather has arrived as a bit of a shock this week, but the extended good weather, into October, did mean that we were able to keep using the field a bit longer this year.

As the cold weather is definitely here now, please ensure that your child has their coat with them every day at school as we will still have playtime outside whenever we can. This included in light rain, so a coat with a hood is always preferable.

I want to take this opportunity to remind parents about the need to be punctual when collecting children at the end of the school day. For Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4, **school ends at 3.30pm** and parents should be waiting for their children at that time. If children are not collected on time they will be taken to the main office and names recorded so we can see patterns.

If late collection continues, your child will be put into After School Club, after 3.40pm and parents **will be charged £5.20** for the first hour of care. Staff well-being is affected and workload is significantly increased if they are regularly having to supervise children who are late being collected.

I want to say a huge **THANK YOU** to parents and children who made donations to our Harvest Festival appeal at the end of September. We donated the food collection to the Bedford Food Bank. The Bedford Food Bank are always very grateful of any donations, but especially in the current ecomomic climate donations are especially well recieved. A letter of thanmks from the Food Bank is shown later in this newsletter.

Secondly, I want to say **THANK YOU** to parents and children for their donations to our #HelloYellow non uniform day on 6<sup>th</sup> October. The children looked fantastic all in



different shades of yellow. If as a school we can have a bit of fun and raise funds to support very worthwhile charities, it is supporting the children's learning about British Values and being a citizen in the UK in 2023. We raised £220 which again is a fantastic amount and will be forwarded to the charity.

It has come to my attention that some Year 5 and 6 children are arriving at school before 8.15am. This is far too early. Children should not be arriving at school until after 8.30am and any children younger than Year 5 **MUST** be accompanied in to school and delivered to their classrooms.

A quick reminder that children should attend school on **Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> October. This is the first day back at school after the half term.**

We will always try to take the children outside at break and lunchtimes, including when it is raining slightly. If your child does not have a coat, they will get wet and have to sit in wet

sweatshirts for the rest of the school day which is not good for them.

## <u>Wear it Pink Day</u>

On Friday 20<sup>st</sup> October we will again be supporting Breast Cancer Awareness by inviting the children to come to school dressed in the colour Pink and making a **minimum £1** donation to the charity. This is a charity that we have enjoyed supporting regularly. Seeing the children in such varying shades of Pink and with such great ideas for wearing pink in creative ways is a great fun, a great sight and supporting a very worthwhile charity. Children should wear at least one item that is pink, if not in uniform.



Parents can make this donation preferably on the school Parent Pay site.

### Homework – Special Reward Time

Close links between home and school matter to us, as we know that parents have a vital role to play in their child's education.

Supporting with homework is a key way in which parents can

support their child's learning journey. As part of the Home School Agreement, parents are asked to 'Support my child with homework, home learning and assist them to 'hand in' on time.'

By working together to support children to take increasing responsibility for their learning as they grow older, good habits will become established and these routines will be the foundations for future learning at Secondary school.

Each week children from Year 1 up to Year 6, will be set homework. There will be a date by which homework must be returned. If children have not returned homework by this date, it is highly likely that unless there are special circumstances, your child will miss their special reward time on a Friday, to complete the learning activities that have not been completed at home.

### Advance Warning

Year 1 and Reception parents - When your child starts talking about phonics, do you wonder what an earth they are talking about? Do you think – 'that isn't how I did it at school?' Do you want to develop the way that you support your child with their reading? We are here to help you!

**Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> November – 9am & 2.45pm** Please come along to our – What is phonics? session where we will show you how we teach phonics in school using the Sounds Write scheme and how you can use these methods to help you child with their reading at home. Please come along and chat with staff and other parents about phonics and early reading over a cuppa and biscuit!

Is your child in Year 6? Please come along to our Y6 SAT's parents' information session.

We will explain what the Year 6 SAT's look like, how we will be preparing your children in school and what you can do at home to help as well.





#### Parent Pay

The school's online payment portal, Parent Pay, is a quick and easy way to pay for most costs, charges or donations to the school. From charity

donations to paying for a trip, school dinners or Breakfast and After School Club. Please remember to allocate your payment to the correct payment item you are paying for.

Breakfast Club and After School Club can be booked and paid for via the website up to 11.59pm the night before a session.

We hope that this will reduce the number of ad hoc sessions that children are accessing.

While Breakfast Club and After School Club are always there if needed as an emergency option to parents, it is important that children are pre booked into sessions so that we can ensure that we have the correct staffing ratios and food available to be able to safely accommodate any emergency bookings that come in during the day.

#### Packed Lunches

#### EDITH CAVELL IS A NUT FREE ZONE

Children bringing packed lunches, **MUST NOT** bring any kind of nut product, which includes peanut butter and chocolate spread, as part of their packed lunch. We have a number of children in school who have allergies to nuts and especially peanuts.





Packed lunches should also be a healthy meal and so should not have packets of sweets or large chocolate bars or large amounts of chocolate. Midday supervisors regularly check lunch boxes, and so will speak to your child about the content of their lunch box if it is considered to contain a high amount of unsuitable or unhealthy items.

In contrast, grapes are a very healthy option to have as part of a packed lunch, but we ask that any children in Reception or KS1 who have grapes as part of their packed lunch or playtime snack, that the grapes are cut length ways. This is to try and prevent choking.



#### Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal 2023



When we return from half term on **Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> October**, we expect that in each phase of the school, **NOT** at the school office, the children will have the opportunity to give a donation to acquire a commemorative poppy. Dear Edith Cavell School,

I am writing to thank you for your recent Harvest food donation which weighed 36.44 kg and would help to provide 86 meals.

Any donations we receive we are always very grateful for and never more so now in these current challenging times. Donations, such as yours, are vital to the on-going provision of food for those in our community who are in such great need. The need for help from the Foodbank continues to increase year upon year and we now regularly feed around 1900 people a month, giving them enough food for 3-4 days, or around 10 meals.

For the month of September 2023, 16 tonnes of food was given out, 945 vouchers were redeemed, 2020 people was fed, of which 704 were children.

Without the support of individuals, organisations, and communities, Bedford Foodbank could not meet the increasing need in Bedford and the surrounding villages.

Thank you all once again, for your support on behalf of everyone who uses, works, or volunteers at the foodbank.

If your child starts talking about an app or web site that you know nothing about Use the web site **Common**

On this site you can look up apps and web sites to see the recommended age rating. Trusted ratings created with families in mind.

Does your child play a game or access an app that is recommended for older children?

- Do you know how the content of that game or app is affecting your child?
- If your child is playing, seeing parents or older siblings playing adult rated games? They are seeing a level of violence not recommended for them.
- Would you take them to the cinema to see an 18+ rated film?

**Google Family Link** is a family parental controls service by Google that allows parents to adjust parameters for their children's devices. The application allows parents to restrict content, approve or disapprove apps, set screen times, and more

### Apple Family Share - Controls & Settings guide

Family Sharing makes it easy for you and up to five family members to share Apple Books, and App Store purchases, photo album, family calendar, an Apple Music family plan, and an iCloud storage plan.

It is also useful if you have children as you can set up tools such as 'Ask to Buy',

locate their devices, set screen time limits for specific apps and much more. A parent or guardian can also set up an Apple ID account for a child under 13 years' old.

#### Samsung Kids Parental Controls

Samsung Kids is a parental feature which you can set up on your child's device which can be used to apply restrictions such as app access, downloading, screen time, privacy and more. It's really easy to set up and use and will help you to manage your child's online activity.

# BONFIRE & FIREWORKS SAFETY

We would always recommend attending an organised bonfire or firework display, but if you do host your own...

- Build the bonfire away from houses, sheds, fences etc.
- Never use flammable liquids like paraffin or petrol to light the fire
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby
- Don't leave the bonfire unattended
- Keep children and pets away

#### You must be 18 years or over to buy and set off fireworks

- Store fireworks in a closed box and take them out one at a time
- Follow the instructions on each firework
- Light fireworks at arm's length, using the taper provided
- Never go back to a lit firework even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode!
- Don't drink alcohol if responsible for setting off fireworks
- Only buy fireworks which carry a CE mark.





- Keep all fancy dress costumes away from naked flames.
- Use LED candles in pumpkins they don't blow out and they are much safer.
- Check the labels on any fancy dress outfits you buy for fire resistance and a registered trademark.
- Remember, cheaper products are more likely to be counterfeit and could burn quickly if they catch fire.

Burns and scalds last a lifetime. Remember if clothing does catch fire, **stop, drop and roll** until the fire is out.

In an emergency cool any burns with large amounts of water and get urgent medical assistance.
