A message from Miss Cooke

Happy New Year

Welcome back to the Spring term. I do hope everyone had a happy and restful holiday and is ready and eager for the new term. The new year is a time to make resolutions or extra effort with something. I have been talking to the children about resolutions and the power of YET. We may not be able to do something YET, but we can work really hard towards that goal that we have. Goals can take many forms, improving our handwriting, learning our tables or reading more for the children. Exercising regularly, watching what we are eating or improving our time keeping for adults. Whatever goals we set ourselves, having a positive mental attitude to achieving those goals is vital in working towards them.

One of the goals that we have as a school is to improve the level of school attendance across the school. This is something that as a whole school community we need to work at together. Especially at this time of year, children do become unwell, but please take note of the Government guidance 'Is my child too ill for school?' which can be accessed on the school website – For Parents – Attendance and here https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/?utm medium=email&utm source=govdelivery

The pace of learning in school is constant and so even one day absent will result in gaps in learning that your child will have to work very hard to fill. A common misconception is that missing school for a very young child is not as important as someone in secondary school. This is not true. If a child does not have good attendance during their early schooling, they are missing essential foundations in learning that will be built on throughout their school life. As with any building, strong foundations in learning are vital to be able to build successfully and securely upon. If your child only has 90% attendance this year that means that they have effectively missed a half day every week. Employers will not accept such poor attendance so it is vital that we develop good attendance habits in children from the start of their school careers.

Following the success of the Parent Showcases that took place in December, we will be repeating these events later in the term, please look on the dates for your diary at the end of this newsletter.

Please can I request that if you have changed your contact details in any way in the last couple of months that you inform the school office. It is vital that we have up to date contact details for all parents so that we can make contact if your child is unwell in school.

Chums – Shine Bright – Wear Bright

To support Children's mental health week 5th – 19th February 2024 we will be holding a non-uniform day on Friday 9th February. On this day we encourage the children to come to school dressed in bright clothing and make a minimum donation of £1 to the CHUMS Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing Service for Children and Young People. Over the week, each class will be thinking about mental health, emotional well-being and how each individual is responsible for their own well-being and mental health.

If a child is not coming to school in uniform, THEY SHOULD MAKE A MINIMUM DONATION. This donation can either be made in cash on the day or via Parent Pay.

Winter clothing

During the winter months we very much want children to wearing appropriate clothing for the weather and so hats, gloves, and scarves are an essential. Please can hats, scarves and gloves be named so that when they have been dropped in the cloakroom there is a chance for returning them to their rightful owners as younger children do not always recognise them as their own when asked.

Children will still go outside for playtime, even if it is raining lightly, so a coat with a hood or a hat available would be preferable.

PE Kit

As a new year resolution, we ask that all families ensure that children have their full and correct PE kit in school every day. This includes correctly fitting footwear. In recent weeks there have been more and more children without correct PE kit and this is restricting learning. Children may also be having PE lessons outside, so please ensure that they have clothing both suitable to wear indoors and wear outdoors.

If you are having difficulty providing your child with PE Kit, please come and talk to staff so that we may offer support.

Any children with pierced ears should have earrings removed at home on PE days as no earrings should be worn during PE lessons for Health and Safety reasons. Also all long hair should be tied up and away from the face so that it does not obscure vision.

Head Lice

Every school in the country, at some point, will have children who suffer an outbreak of Head lice. Edith Cavell is no exception. To this end we ask that parents are extremely vigilant and check their child's hair on a weekly basis. Combing with a small toothed comb is advised to check and treat an outbreak. Advice from the NHS advises that the whole family be checked regularly and treated if an outbreak is detected in any family member. To help limit the spread of head lice, advice is that any long or shoulder length hair be tied up during the school day. We encourage all parents and children to comply with this advice. We invite all children to bring their mum, step mum, foster mum, grandma, nanny, important female figure in their life to join us for breakfast on Friday 8th March.


Attendance


