Parent Governor Vacancies

There are currently vacancies for parent governors on the Governing Body of the school. If you wish to stand for election for one of the vacant parent governors positions, you will need to complete a nomination form, along with a declaration of eligibility. Nomination forms will need to be returned to the School Office by Friday 1st March 2024

Parent governors play a very important role in keeping the governing body aware of the views from the parental perspective. They are a vital part of our team and I hope that there are parents willing to give their time and commitment to this important role. Attached are details of what will be expected of a Governor.

If two or more nominations are received, I shall arrange for parents to receive ballot papers which will include the candidates' election statements. Votes will be counted at 11am on Friday 22nd March 2024. Candidates may attend the count. I shall arrange for all parents to be notified of the result.

What qualifications do governors need?

There are no formal qualifications. Schools need volunteers with experience of life. The one essential requirement is an interest in, and commitment to, the education of all the children in the school. Governors are ordinary people, drawn from many areas of society. They need to be able to devote time to getting to know the school well and be available to support and challenge it.

A governor must be a good listener, and someone who is able to read and take in information easily. A governor must be able to:

- raise questions and take part in discussion and decision-making
- be discreet, open minded and fair
- be a source of ideas and a good communicator
- be enthusiastic about the work of the school
- be prepared to work as part of a team.

Whilst schools are keen to welcome applications from all areas of society, there are certain criteria that have to be met before your application can be accepted. Eligability to serve as a school governor can be found on the school web site at https://www.edithcavellprimary.co.uk/vacancies/

How long do governors serve?

The usual term of office is four years. However, governors are volunteers who can leave at any time and can similarly be re-appointed or re-elected.

At Edith Cavell we normally hold three full governing body meetings per year. You will also be required to serve on one of the committees – a further three meetings a year. Each meeting is held at 8am, 6.30pm or 7pm depending on which committee and is a maximum of two hours per meeting.

What kinds of help and support are available?

A great deal of professional advice and support is available to help governors with their duties and responsibilities, along with a full training programme which is run by the Local Authority.
