

Parking on Knellor Close

I have again had contact from concerned residents about the actions of parents when coming to school, in their cars, to drop off their children. Residents report that parents are not parking considerably, are just pulling up in the middle of the road, are using and blocking resident's driveways.



When I am able to stand up on Knellor Close, or the borough parking attendants are in attendance, parents seem to remember that they should park considerately, but as soon as either I or parking attendants are not present, parents revert back to parking without consideration or according to the highway code.

This is an ongoing issue, and I can only urge all parents who park on Knellor Close to examine their own conscience about the actions they take and the example that they are setting their children.

Early finish on Thursday, 28th March 2024

We would like to give parents the opportunity to collect their children early on the afternoon of the last day of term, Thursday, 28th March 2024. Children may be collected at **1.45pm**.

Any child may stay in school until the normal end of the school day if parents are working or they do not wish to collect them early.

PE Kit and footwear



Across the school we have seen an increase in the number of children not having their PE kit in school on the correct days and also not having correctly fitting footwear.

It is important for Health and Safety that children are able to change their clothing into more lose fitting, less restrictive clothing to take part in PE lessons and even more important that they have correctly fitting shoes that

are appropriate for physical activity.

PE kits can remain in school for the half term to ensure that they are available on any day that the class engages in PE activities, or your if child is part of an after school PE based club.

PE lessons are a vital part of the school curriculum and help to build a healthy attitude to exercise as well as develop gross and fine motor skills for life. All children need to be able to take part fully and comfortably.

Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes(BLMK) Integrated Care Board



The Healthier Together website is a digital resource which has been coproduced by the ICS Children and Young People's (CYP) team with the support of young people, parent carer forums, system partners and clinicians across BLMK to support our CYP population and their parents and carers. It aims to empower

parents and carers with the right tools to manage their children and young people's physical health and emotional well-being. In addition, it also has lots of information for young people themselves to access.

The section for <u>Parents/Carers</u> covers key areas such as 'Should my child go to school/nursery today', information on a range of common illnesses and childhood vaccinations, in addition to a large section on SEND.

Another section entitled <u>Health for Young People</u> speaks directly to young people and provides information on mental health, sexual health and LGBTQ+ issues. This gives extensive guidance, including 'What to do in a Crisis', 'Where to Get Help' and 'Self-help Ideas.' There is also a lifestyle section which focuses on topics such as healthy eating and exercise, much of which has been co-produced with young people.

Thanks to a functionality called Recite Me, the site is also accessible to people who may be disabled, visually impaired, speak English as a second language or are elderly. The web content can be translated into over **100 different languages.**

The Home Upgrade Grant Phase 2 (HUG2)



Families struggling to pay energy bills could get free home energy improvements. HUG2 is a government-funded scheme for low-income

households open to homeowners and private tenants in:

Homes not heated by mains gas which includes oil, coal, LPG or only electric heating.

AND

 Households with a combined annual income of less than £36,000; receiving an income-related means-tested benefit such as Universal Credit or there is a child living at the premises eligible for free school meals due to low income. Households in Bedford Borough, which has been prioritised for funding, will also be eligible.

AND

Hard to heat homes – this is based on your home Energy Performance Certificate (EPC). Families
will be helped with this part of the assessment.

Report from LKS2 Faith Tour

On Wednesday 28th February 2024, children in LKS2 participated in a Faith Tour around three places of worship in Queen's Park Bedford. These were the Guru Nanak Gurdwara, All Saints Church, and the Jameh Masjid Gulshan-e-Bagdhad Mosque.

In the church, the pupils learned about important religious artefacts, and searched for items that were important to Christians. We learned about festivals such as Easter and Christmas, and even got to see the different robes which would be worn at different times of the year.

In the mosque, we were taken through the 5 Pillars of Islam, and we learned how Muslims live their lives. We were all fascinated by the digital display showing the different prayer times, and were interested in the intricate ceiling mouldings in the main prayer room.

In the gurdwara, we were given information about the Five Ks for Sikhs, and were taken on a tour to see a huge prayer hall which was decorated with flowers. The pupils were very well-behaved and respectful

throughout the visit, and they enjoyed finding out about the similarities and differences

between these religions.








