A message from Miss Cooke

A little belated, but welcome back to the Summer term. There is lots going on in school this term and before we know it we will be at the end of July and the school year! We hope that there is an improvement in the weather so that we can all start to enjoy the outdoors, especially with the two bank holidays coming up in May.

We welcomed a number of new children into Little Treasures, our Pre-School class, after the Easter holidays. We welcome these children and their families to Edith Cavell and look forward to developing that vital relationship with families to ensure that their children are settled, happy and ready to learn.

Ensuring that children arrive at school, ready to learn is one of the most important parts of a school day. If children come to school, daily, on time, well rested, having eaten and bringing everything that they will need for the school day this gives every child a settled and positive start to the school day. Parents ensuring that they collect their child promptly at the end of the school day is also crucial. Parents should be waiting for their children when the end of school bell rings. Over the next few weeks, I will be writing out to parents to remind them of important points that are featured on the Home School Agreement, that all parents sign at the start of the year, or when their child joins the school. The aspects of the Home School Agreement that I will select to expand on, will be chosen as they are aspects that we have noticed are not as tight as they were at the start of the year. This could be for many reasons, and we wish to ensure that all parents are reminded and are fully aware of regular, important, procedural, expectations and processes around the school. Please look out for these reminders and read carefully.

A **HUGE THANK YOU** to all children, parents and families for helping to raise a whopping £1600 for our sponsored skip that took place just after February half term. This is a massive amount of money that we can use in school. I promised the children that if we managed to raise more than £1000, each class would be allocated £50 to be able to choose books for the classroom library. We have smashed this figure, so the children are excited to work together to choose books for their class libraries. The remainder of the money raised will be used to further supplement our reading book resources. The children will be involved with helping to choose additional books to join our reading scheme stock as well.

To support the work that Mrs Cavill does across the school, we have appointed a new Family Support Worker(FSW) to support families and children. Mrs Hayley Pearce will be moving into the FSW role, while maintaining some of her TA duties.

Mrs Pearce will be available to speak to parents about any issues that they may be having relating to their child and school. This could include issues around attendance, any support parents may want around routines, bedtimes, supporting with homework and accessing other services. Please look out for Mrs Pearce around on the playgrounds at the start of the day, or come to reception to make an appointment to meet with her.

School uniform

In assemblies, the children have been reminded about the expectations around wearing correct school uniform, not wearing jewellery in school and the need to wear school shoes and not trainers. I have particularly noticed that children are not wearing school shoes. We are well aware that children grow, but when you are purchasing new shoes for your child, there is a requirement for every child to wear school shoes.

School uniform is an important part of school life and our children should wear uniform because:

- Our uniform identifies us as a community and reinforces our culture of high expectations and raising standards in academic achievement.
- Uniform unites us as a community: we learn, practice, play and succeed together.
- Uniform reduces distractions: we are focused on our learning.
- Uniform makes us all equal: we come to school looking the same way; no one has to feel awkward about the clothes they have or don't have.
- Uniform gives us all an identity to be part of and proud of.
- Uniforms are professional
