# Newsletter - October 2024

### A message from Miss Cooke

As we come to the end of what will be the longest half term of the academic year, children and staff are ready for a break and a chance to recharge their batteries. We have had many children and staff suffering with mild infections and half term is the opportunity to recover health and catch up with sleep.

I have recently shared a copy of the Ofsted Report written after the inspection visit in July with all parents. It can also be accessed on the school Website and will be displayed on the Ofsted Website from the start of November. The report rightly outlines an overwhelmingly positive opinion of Edith Cavell and the work that the children, staff and governors do. The third paragraph totally sums up Edith Cavell

"Pupils' behaviour is commendable. Respect and tolerance are evident in all relationships. Everyone is kept safe. There is a culture of vigilance. Parents and carers are positive about the school and their children's education. Pupils are overwhelmingly positive about the school, their lessons and the wider opportunities provided. There have been items in the press about the Governments wish that all schools will be able to offer wrap around care from 8am to 6pm. At Edith Cavell we currently offer wrap around care from 8am to 5.30pm. We would like to gather your opinions on if extending our After School Club times up to 6pm would be financially viable and something that parents will find useful and use. Please look out for the survey that will be emailed out in the next few days.

I want to take this opportunity to remind parents about the need to be punctual when collecting children at the end of the school day. For Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4, **school ends at 3.30pm** and parents should be waiting for their children at that time. If children are not collected on time they will be taken to the main office and names recorded so we can see patterns.

If late collection continues, your child will be put into After School Club, after 3.40pm and parents will be charged £5.45 for the first hour of care. Staff well-being is affected and workload is significantly increased if they are regularly having to supervise children who are late being collected.

I want to say **THANK YOU** to parents and children for their donations to our #HelloYellow non uniform day on 6<sup>th</sup> October. The children looked fantastic all in different shades of yellow. If as



a school we can have a bit of fun and raise funds to support very worthwhile charities, it is supporting the children's learning about British Values and being a citizen in the UK in 2024. We raised £220 which again is a fantastic amount and will be forwarded to the charity.

A quick reminder that children should attend school on **Monday**, **4**<sup>th</sup> **November. This is the first day back at school after the half term.**

## <u>Homework – Special Reward Time</u>

Close links between home and school matter to us, as we know that parents have a vital role to play in their child's education.



Supporting with homework is a key way in which parents can

support their child's learning journey. As part of the Home School Agreement, parents are asked to 'Support my child with homework, home learning and assist them to 'hand in' on time.'

By working together to support children to take increasing responsibility for their learning as they grow older, good habits will become established and these routines will be the foundations for future learning at Secondary school.

Each week children from Year 1 up to Year 6, will be set homework. There will be a date by which homework must be returned. If children have not returned homework by this date, it is highly likely that unless there are special circumstances, your child will miss their special reward time on a Friday, to complete the learning activities that have not been completed at home.

Year 1 and Reception parents - When your child starts talking about phonics, do you wonder what an earth they are talking about? Do you think — 'that isn't how I did it at school?' Do you want to develop the way that you support your child with their reading? We are here to help you!

We will explain what the Year 6 SAT's look like, how we will be preparing your children in school and what you can do at home to help as well.

#### **Parent Pay**

The school's online payment portal, Parent Pay, is a quick and easy way to pay for most costs, charges or donations to the school. From charity



donations to paying for a trip, school dinners or Breakfast and After School Club. Please remember to allocate your payment to the correct payment item you are paying for.

Breakfast Club and After School Club can be booked and paid for via the website up to 11.59pm the night before a session.

We hope that this will reduce the number of ad hoc sessions that children are accessing.

While Breakfast Club and After School Club are always there if needed as an emergency option to parents, it is important that children are pre booked into sessions so that we can ensure that we have the correct staffing ratios and food available to be able to safely accommodate any emergency bookings that come in during the day.

## **Caterlink School Dinner Changes**

After half-term Caterlink will be moving to a system, still on ParentPay, where parents will choose and book their child's school dinner either daily or weekly. Payment will continue as normal where appropriate.

## **EDITH CAVELL IS A NUT FREE ZONE**




Children bringing packed lunches, **MUST NOT** bring any kind of nut product, which includes peanut butter and chocolate spread, as part of their packed lunch. We have a number of children in school who have allergies to nuts and especially peanuts.



Packed lunches should also be a healthy meal and so should not have packets of sweets or large chocolate bars or large amounts of chocolate. Midday supervisors regularly check lunch boxes, and so will speak to your child about the content of their lunch box if it is considered to contain a high amount of unsuitable or unhealthy items.

In contrast, grapes are a very healthy option to have as part of a packed lunch, but we ask that any children in Reception or KS1 who have grapes as part of their packed lunch or playtime snack, that the grapes are cut length ways. This is to try and prevent choking.



### Message from the Police

For Parents - Video Games and Children

#### YouTube - Parental Controls for Teens

Google (YouTube) have, in the past, always argued that YouTube is strictly for over 13's, much like most other social platforms. This age is predominantly for marketing/advertising purposes. However, that argument has never stood up given that Google have never had a means to prevent under 13's using the platform without an account.

Back in 2021 YouTube introduced new parental features, called <u>Supervised Experience</u>, and this was for parents of children under 13 who were using YouTube.

Now, it looks like YouTube is extending Supervised Experience for parents of teenagers. In early September they announced that parents/carers will be able to link their teenagers account to the parent account where

parents will have the ability to see some limited information such as number of video uploads, comments etc.

I think some parents may be disappointed that this is quite a limited set of features and I would agree. You can read more about this HERE.


